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## Executive Summary

The 2001 Census Data Technical Report consists of data for five Census Agricultural Regions (CARs) within Ontario: Southern Ontario, Western Ontario, Central Ontario, Eastern Ontario and Northern Ontario. Within these CARs are several Census Divisions. The items documented in this report include: Major Field Crops, Major Fruit Crops, Major Vegetable Crops and Livestock. Data available in this report include the item occupying the land, provincial data, CAR level data, and County level data. The percentage of province is also included, showing the percentage of the total amount of the province that each location (region or county) contains. This is used to rank the top five county level producers as well to identify top producers of each item.

### **Major Field Crops**

#### **❖ Winter Wheat:**

- Southern Ontario and Western Ontario are the major producers with 55.03% and 34.8% of the provincial total respectively
- Lambton County, Chatham-Kent Division and Middlesex County in Southern Ontario were ranked first, third and fourth, with 13.8%, 9.57% and 8.91% of provincial production respectively
- Two counties located in Western Ontario ranked in the top 5. Huron County was second with 10.77% of the province and Perth County fifth with 6.37% of provincial production

#### **❖ Oats:**

- Production was fairly even across the regions. Eastern Ontario produced the most with 22.46% of provincial production, followed by Western Ontario with 22.36%, Southern Ontario with 20.33%, Central Ontario with 19.95% and Northern Ontario with 14.89%
- The top 5 county level producers were spread out across each region as well. Renfrew County from Eastern Ontario came first with 6.33% of provincial production, followed by Timiskaming District of Northern Ontario with 5.62%, Northumberland County of Central Ontario with 4.9%, Haldimand-Norfolk Regional Municipality of Southern Ontario with 4.48%, and finally Grey County with 4.1%

#### **❖ Barley:**

- Production is dominated by Western Ontario with 51.29% of the province while the second largest producer, Eastern Ontario, only had 18.47%
- The top 3 and the fifth county level producer of Barley were located in Western Ontario. Ranked first was Grey County with 9.08% of provincial production, followed by Wellington County with 8.35%, Bruce County with 8.09% and in fifth was Simcoe County with 6.28%
- Timiskaming District of Northern Ontario was fourth with 7.21% of provincial production

❖ **Mixed Grain:**

- Western Ontario dominated production, accounting for 63.22% of provincial production
- The top 5 county level producers were all located in Western Ontario. Grey County was first with 12.83% of provincial production, followed by Wellington County with 10.18%, Bruce County with 9.3%, Perth County with 8.39% and finally Waterloo Regional Municipality with 7.05%

❖ **Grain Corn:**

- Southern Ontario and Western Ontario were the major producers representing 46.15% and 30.98% of total production of the province respectively
- Huron County of Western Ontario was the top county level producer with 9.16% of the province and Perth County of Western Ontario was fifth with 6.71% of the province
- The rest of the top five county level producers were from Southern Ontario. Middlesex County was second with 8.57% of the province, Chatham-Kent Division was third with 8.23%, and Oxford County with fourth with 7.29%

❖ **Soybeans:**

- Southern Ontario was the major producer with 58.78% of the province followed by Western Ontario with 26.25%
- The top four county producers were from Southern Ontario. Lambton County was the top producer with 12.39% of provincial production, Chatham-Kent Division second with 10.91%, Essex County third with 8.41%, and Middlesex County fourth with 7.98%
- Ranked fifth was Huron County in Western Ontario with 7.83% of provincial production

❖ **White Beans:**

- County and regional data did not add up, so analysis may not be done properly
- According to the data reported from the census, Southern Ontario was the main producer of White Bean with 64% of the province, followed by Western Ontario with 10.47%
- Huron County of Western Ontario was ranked first with 29.71% of provincial production, followed by Bruce County with 8.77% also in Western Ontario
- Counties of Southern Ontario were ranked third to fifth with Middlesex county having 8.5% of provincial production, Chatham-Kent Division with 3.85% and finally Lambton County with 2.77%

❖ **Fodder Corn:**

- Western Ontario was the major producer with 45.24% of provincial production. Southern Ontario came second with 21.38% and Eastern Ontario third with 19.78%
- The top five county producers were all in Western Ontario. Wellington County was first with 8.58% of province, followed by Perth County with 6.89%, Huron

County with 6.81%, Waterloo Regional Municipality with 6.43% and Bruce County with 6.32%

❖ **Hay:**

- The major producers of hay was Western Ontario with 31.77% of provincial production, followed by Eastern Ontario with 26.17%
- Grey County and Bruce County of Western Ontario was ranked the top two county level producers with 7.04% and 5.19% of the provincial production respectively
- The United Counties of Dundas, Glengarry and Stormont of Eastern Ontario was third by a mere 16 acres and Simcoe County of Western Ontario was in fourth place. However, both counties had about 4.55% of the provincial production
- Renfrew County of Eastern Ontario was fifth with 4.36% of provincial production

❖ **Tobacco:**

- Production was only available in Southern Ontario
- Haldimand-Norfolk Regional Municipality was the top county level producer with 55.79% of provincial production, followed by Elgin County with 14.78%, Oxford County with 10.18%, Brant County with 9.88% and finally Chatham-Kent Division with 4.15%

❖ **Potatoes:**

- Western Ontario and Southern Ontario were the major producers representing 57.6% and 28.43% of provincial production respectively
- Simcoe County and Dufferin County of Western Ontario were ranked first and second of the top county level producers with 35.81% and 15.33% of provincial production respectively
- Brant County, Lambton County, and Haldimand-Norfolk Regional Municipality were ranked third to fifth of the top county level producers with 6.27%, 5.51% and 5.01% of provincial production respectively

**Major Fruit Crops**

❖ **Apples:**

- Southern Ontario with 47.36% of provincial production and Western Ontario with 32.72% were the major producers
- Grey County of Western Ontario was the top county level producer with 23.35% of provincial production
- Three counties in Southern Ontario were ranked in the top five. Haldimand-Norfolk Regional Municipality was second with 13.11% of provincial production, Essex County was third with 9.27%, and Elgin County was fifth with 4.95%
- Durham Regional Municipality of Central Ontario was ranked fourth with 6.77% of provincial production

❖ **Peaches:**

- Southern Ontario dominates the production of peaches with 99.56% of the province
- The top five county level producers are all located in Southern Ontario. However, Niagara Regional Municipality is the major producer with 87.56% of provincial production, followed by Essex County with 5.2%, Chatham-Kent Division with 3.13%, Lambton County with 1.53% and lastly Elgin County with 1.13%

❖ **Sour Cherries:**

- Southern Ontario is the major producer with 97.62% of provincial production
- Niagara Regional Municipality was the top county level producer with 48.14% of provincial production, followed by Haldimand-Norfolk Regional Municipality with 34.79%, Brant County with 5.19%, Chatham-Kent Division with 4.93% and finally Hamilton with 1.9%. All these counties are from Southern Ontario

❖ **Raspberries:**

- Production is evenly distributed except for Northern Ontario. Southern Ontario had 25.94% of the provincial production, Western Ontario had 24.94%, Central Ontario had 21.86%, Eastern Ontario had 21.48% while Northern Ontario only had 3.16%
- Simcoe County of Western Ontario was the top county level producer with 7.24% of provincial production, followed by Durham Regional Municipality of Central Ontario with 7.01%, Niagara Regional Municipality of Southern Ontario with 6.31%, Halton Regional Municipality of Western Ontario with 5.39% and finally Ottawa Division of Eastern Ontario with 5.08%

❖ **Strawberries:**

- Production is fairly distributed across the regions except for Northern Ontario. Southern Ontario represents 36.08% of provincial production, Central Ontario represents 20.91%, Western Ontario represents 20.17%, Eastern Ontario represents 14.93% and Northern Ontario only represents 5.44%
- The top county level producer was Haldimand-Norfolk Regional Municipality of Southern Ontario with 13.73% of provincial production, followed by Durham Regional Municipality of Central Ontario with 6.08%, Simcoe County of Western Ontario with 5.52%, Ottawa Division of Eastern Ontario with 4.96%, and lastly York Region Municipality of Central Ontario with 4.9%

❖ **Grapes:**

- The major producer is Southern Ontario with 97.75% of provincial production
- The top five county level producers are from Southern Ontario. However, Niagara Regional Municipality dominates the production with 85.77% of the province, followed by Essex County with only 6.46%, Hamilton County with 3.88%, York Region Municipality with 1.14%, and lastly Haldimand-Norfolk Regional Municipality with 0.82%

❖ **Total Fruit Crops:**

- Southern Ontario is the major producer accounting for 71.42% of provincial production, while in second was Western Ontario with 15.48% and Central Ontario with 9% in third
- Niagara Regional Municipality was the top county level producer accounting for 43.2% of provincial production, followed by Grey County with 9.06%, Haldimand-Norfolk Regional Municipality with 8.09%, and Essex County with 6.3%. These four counties are all located in Southern Ontario
- Grey County in Western Ontario was ranked fifth with 3.26% of provincial production

**Major Vegetable Crops**❖ **Sweet Corn:**

- Southern Ontario and Western Ontario were the major producers of sweet corn with 65.36% and 20.32% of provincial production respectively
- Four counties in Southern Ontario were in the top five county level producers. Middlesex County was first with 16.56% of provincial production, Lambton County second with 11.53%, Elgin County fourth with 8.79% and Haldimand-Norfolk Regional Municipality fifth with 8.19%
- Perth County of Western Ontario ranked third with 9.16% of provincial production

❖ **Tomatoes:**

- Production is dominated by Southern Ontario, representing 95.69% of the province
- The top five county level producers were all from Southern Ontario. Chatham-Kent Division was the top producer with 56.72% of the province, followed by Essex County with 27.73%, Haldimand-Norfolk Regional Municipality with 6.33%, Brant County with 1.17%, and lastly Lambton County with 1.01%

❖ **Green Peas:**

- Southern Ontario was the major producer representing 75.25% of provincial production followed by Western Ontario with 16.58%
- Middlesex County was the top county level producer with 22.34% of provincial production, Chatham-Kent Division with 16.75%, Elgin County with 14.28%, Oxford County with 9.82% and lastly Lambton County with 8.03%

❖ **Green or Wax Beans**

- Southern Ontario dominates production contributing 71.38% of provincial production followed by Central Ontario with 15.73% and Western Ontario with 11.02%
- Huron of Western Ontario was ranked third for county level producers with 7.94% of provincial production
- The rest of the top five county level producers are from Southern Ontario. Middlesex County was first with 18.05% of the province, Brant County second

with 14.02%, Hamilton County fourth with 2.82% and Chatham-Kent Division fifth with 2.44%

❖ **Total Vegetables:**

- The major producer was Southern Ontario which represents 68.21% of provincial production followed by Western Ontario with 17.04% and Central Ontario with 12.3%
- The top five county level producers were all in Southern Ontario. Chatham-Kent Division was the top producer with 14.58% of provincial production, Middlesex County second with 10.12%, Haldimand-Norfolk Regional Municipality third with 9.49%, Essex County fourth with 7.86% and Elgin County fifth with 6.86%

**Livestock Inventories**

❖ **Dairy Cows:**

- Western Ontario represents 34.67% of provincial production, Eastern Ontario represents 28.44% and Southern Ontario represents 20.89%
- The United Counties of Dundas, Glengarry and Stormont of Eastern Ontario was the top producer with 9.11% of provincial production, followed by Perth County of Western Ontario with 8.22%, Oxford County of Southern Ontario with 8.19%, Prescott and Russell United Counties of Eastern Ontario with 7.27% and lastly Wellington County of Western Ontario with 6.42%

❖ **Beef Cows:**

- Western Ontario is the major producer with 37.13% of provincial production, followed by Eastern Ontario with 21.57% and Central Ontario with 19.5%
- The top county level producer is Grey County of Western Ontario with 8.76% of provincial production, in second is Bruce County of Western Ontario with 7.8%, in third is Renfrew County of Eastern Ontario with 6.06%, in fourth is Simcoe County of Western Ontario with 5.38% and in fifth is Kawartha Lakes Division with 5.15%

❖ **Steers:**

- Western Ontario is the dominant producer with 67.59% of provincial production, and in a far second place is Southern Ontario with 17.49%
- The top five county level producers are all located in Western Ontario. Bruce County was first with 13.56% of provincial production, Huron County second with 11.68%, Waterloo Regional Municipality third with 11.47%, Wellington County fourth with 9.59% and Grey County fifth with 9.28%

❖ **Total Cattle and Calves:**

- Western Ontario was the major producer with 45.16% of provincial production, followed by Eastern Ontario with 18.76%, Southern Ontario with 17.54%, Central Ontario with 13.05% and Northern Ontario with only 5.48%
- The top five county level producers are all located in Western Ontario. The top producer was Bruce County with 8.52% of the province, second was Huron

County with 6.89%, third was Grey County with 6.78%, fourth was Wellington County with 6.23% and fifth was Perth County with 5.5%

❖ **Total Pigs:**

- Provincial production was dominated by Western Ontario with 54.22% and Southern Ontario with 40.45% of the province.
- Huron County was the top county level producer with 18.23% of provincial production, followed by Perth County with 16.5%. Both are located in Western Ontario
- The rest of the top five counties are located in Southern Ontario. Oxford county was third with 11.31%, Middlesex county was fourth with 8.15%, and Lambton fifth with 7.23%

❖ **Total Sheep and Lambs:**

- Western Ontario was the major provincial producer with 45.51% of provincial production, followed by Central Ontario with 18.1%, Southern Ontario with 16.89%, Eastern Ontario with 14.68% and finally Northern Ontario with only 4.82%
- All of the top five county level producers are located in Western Ontario. Grey County was top producer with 11.12% of provincial production, followed by Bruce County with 8.54%, Simcoe County with 6.89%, Huron County with 6.08%, and finally Wellington County with 4.67%

❖ **Total Hens and Chickens:**

- Production was mainly located in Western Ontario with 44.26% of provincial production and Southern Ontario with 39.88%
- The top county level producer was Huron County of Western Ontario with 11.53% of provincial production. Niagara Regional Municipality of Southern Ontario was second with 10.63%, Perth County of Western Ontario third with 8.78%, Wellington County of Western Ontario fourth with 8.65%, and Oxford County of Southern Ontario fifth with 6.53%

❖ **Total Turkeys:**

- Southern Ontario dominated production with 61.2% of the province, followed by Western Ontario with 33.55%
- Oxford County and Middlesex County of Southern Ontario was the top 2 county level producers with 20.09% and 14.45% of provincial production respectively
- Ranked third to fifth was counties from Western Ontario. Waterloo Regional Municipality was third with 7.65% of provincial production, Wellington County fourth with 7.28%, and Huron County fifth with 6.8%

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## Overview

Original data was acquired from the 2001 Farm Census conducted by the Ontario Ministry of Agricultural Food and Rural Affairs (OMAFRA). Each section of this report provides information on items that occupy land across Ontario. There are five regions; Southern Ontario, Western Ontario, Central Ontario, Eastern Ontario and Northern Ontario. Each region consists of counties. The items that are covered in this report are: Major Field Crops, Major Fruit Crops, Major Vegetable Crops and Livestock. This report consists of county level data, regional level data, provincial level data and the percentage of province. The percentage of province is how much each location (county or region) has of the item as a percentage of the total amount of the province.

The structure of this report is as follows: item occupying land - regional data – county level data – top five county level producers. Each county is sorted in its respective region from top to bottom; top being the largest producer and bottom being the smallest producer. Additionally, the top five county level producers of each item for the province are identified and are ranked according to the percentage of province. This table is located at the bottom of each item being reported. This will help identify who produces what and who produces the most.

At the end of the row for each region are two numbers. The numbers are hidden on the print version of this report but can be seen in the electronic form once the hidden option is checked off. The values on the left indicate the sum of the items in that region (acres or numbers). The number on the right indicates the sum of the percentage of the province. This is to ensure that entered data correspond with data reported from the 2001 census. It was observed that Northern Ontario data was reported in different units for some items. The regional data for the Northern Ontario was reported in hectares while the county level data was reported in acres for Major Field Crops, Major Fruit Crops and Major Vegetable Crops. However, on all other pages of the Census report, the provincial totals (same as regional data) were reported in acres. After further inspection, the percentage of province was found to be calculated using the acreage values. Therefore the hectare unit

can be disregarded. Furthermore, due to minor rounding errors, some additions did not correspond exactly with the values reported by the Census but these incidents did not have an effect on the analysis. However, data for White Beans for Major Field crops was observed to have to have a large deviation for data from the Census compared to the addition check. This can not be attributed to rounding errors due to the large difference, therefore analysis of data was based on data that was reported by OMAFRA.

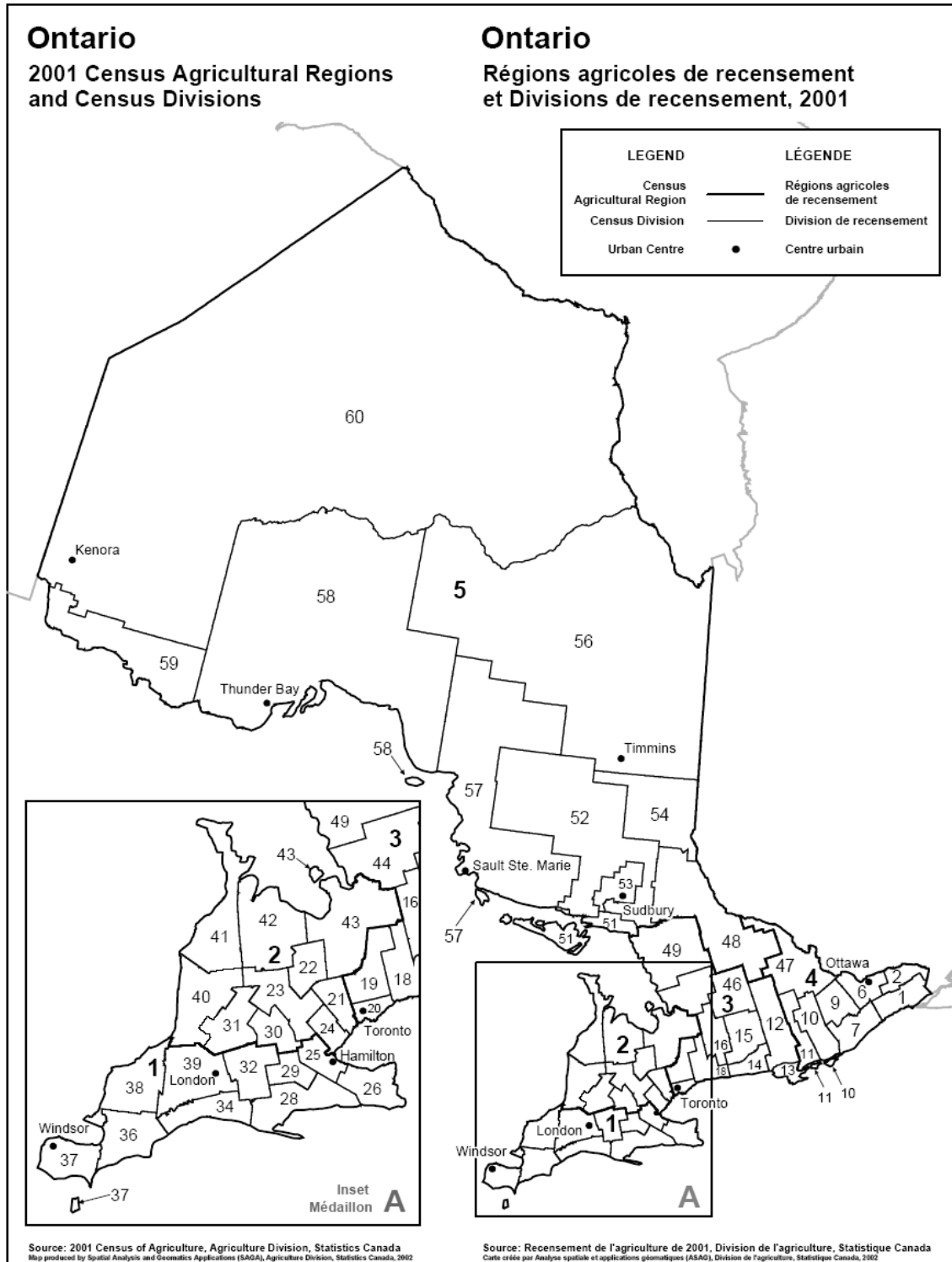

Southern Ontario and Western Ontario are the major producers of winter wheat. Southern Ontario has a 55.03% share of the total provincial total while Western Ontario has a 34.8% share. However Western Ontario still has two counties that are ranked in the top five county level producers with *Huron* which ranked second and *Perth* which ranked fifth. The rest of the top five county level producers are located in Southern Ontario: *Lambton* the top producer, at 13.8% of the provincial total, *Chatham-Kent Division* ranked third at 9.57% and *Middlesex* ranked fourth at 8.91%.

Southern Ontario and Western Ontario are the major contributors for total turkey production in Ontario.
