

The Saskatchewan Research Council's (SRC) Project CLEANS team is pleased to inform the community that work on the Gunnar Mine and Mill Remediation Project will resume this spring.

On July 29, 2025, the QM Group obtained an Initial Court Order pursuant to the federal *Companies' Creditors Arrangement Act* (CCAA). These external legal matters outside of SRC's control resulted in the early season closure of the site in September of 2025. However, that situation as it relates to the Gunnar project has been resolved and an agreement is in place for QM Points Contracting CP Inc. to resume remediation work, with project completion targeted for fall 2026.

Remaining work still to be completed on site includes completion of the Langley Bay Tailings cover, seeding all remaining covers, decommissioning of the camp, miscellaneous tasks, and demobilization of the contractor's equipment and infrastructure.

SRC reminds all community members that the Gunnar site remains an active construction zone. For safety and regulatory reasons, access to the Gunnar site is strictly prohibited without prior written authorization from SRC.
