



Snowstorm in a Jar

Ingredients:

- Empty jar
- Baby oil
- Effervescent tablets
- Large measuring cup
- 1 cup water
- ½ cup white paint
- Glitter
- Spoon

How to make it:

- 1. Set up an empty jar on a tray and pour baby oil to 2/3 of the jar.
- 2. Mix water with white paint in your measuring cup.
- 3. Pour the paint mixture into the jar.
- 4. Add some glitter to your jar for extra fun.
- 5. Drop one effervescent tablet into the jar. (You can also break the tablet in half). Now watch the snowstorm!
- 6. When it stops, add more tablets to reactivate the snowstorm!

Let's Learn Science: Oil is less dense than water, so the paint mixture stays at the bottom of the jar. When we drop effervescent tablets into the jar, the interaction with the water creates upward pressure, and the oil pushes it back down. Another important element in the experiment is sodium bicarbonate in the tablets, which creates carbon dioxide gas when mixed with water. The combination of these factors creates a cool snowstorm!
